For more than a century, Scottish Rite for Children has been dedicated to giving children back their childhood. The institution is a world-renowned leader in the treatment of pediatric orthopedic conditions, such as scoliosis, clubfoot, hand differences, hip disorders, limb lengthening and reconstruction, sports injuries and fractures, as well as certain related arthritic and neurological disorders and learning disorders, such as dyslexia. To address the needs of the growing pediatric population in North Texas, Scottish Rite offers three locations — Dallas, Frisco and The Star in Frisco. Families from around the world pursue best-in-class care at Scottish Rite for Children.

ADVANCING PEDIATRIC RESEARCH

Research plays a vital role in ensuring every child receives leading-edge treatment. Scottish Rite researchers conduct in-depth basic, applied and clinical research, working with clinicians to translate discoveries into new treatment methods and medical devices. Researchers have identified and mapped genes associated with adolescent idiopathic scoliosis, clubfoot and lupus. Patient outcomes continue to advance due to innovative studies conducted in the Centers for Excellence in Foot, Hand, Hip, Limb Lengthening & Reconstruction, Spine and Sports Medicine.

SHAPING THE FUTURE OF MEDICINE

The next generation of medical professionals choose Scottish Rite for its robust educational opportunities offered through a variety of fellowship and residency programs. The widely respected and sought after Dorothy & Bryant Edwards Fellowship in Pediatric Orthopedics and Scoliosis program is the largest pediatric orthopedic fellowship in the world. Scottish Rite also trains medical professionals across fields and subspecialties,

including sports medicine, rheumatology, psychology, orthotics and prosthetics, nursing and more. Upon graduation, fellows and residents join an alumni network that extends Scottish Rite’s reach, transforming the lives of children around the world.

MEET OUR PATIENTS

MIA, OF KERENS, TX with Elizabeth E. Sloan, M.D.

Two years ago, Mia woke up with swelling and pain in her knees. Her family searched for care options and discovered Scottish Rite for Children. Mia was diagnosed with polyarticular juvenile idiopathic arthritis, which causes inflammation in five or more joints. Pediatric rheumatologist Elizabeth E. Sloan, M.D., and a team of nurses created a treatment plan to help improve Mia’s symptoms. Since then, Mia is back to cheerleading and enjoying playtime with her younger sister, especially when they pretend to be Elsa and Anna from “Frozen.”

“For our family, Scottish Rite for Children feels like a second home,” says Yaresi, Mia’s mother. “We just put our trust in God and in Mia’s care team. Seeing Mia walk, run and play again reminds us it is all worth it in the end.”

Seth enjoys playing football and wrestling. Last year, his active lifestyle was interrupted when he developed a limp. Seth was diagnosed with Legg-Calvé-Perthes disease, a rare childhood hip disorder that affects his left hip. After hearing a podcast, Seth’s parents discovered pediatric orthopedic surgeon and Director of the Center for Excellence in Hip Harry Kim, M.D., M.S., and his research on Perthes disease. Soon after, Seth and his family traveled from Oklahoma to Texas to receive specialized care at Scottish Rite for Children. Dr. Kim performed surgery on Seth’s hip, and now, he is back on the path of healing.

“Dr. Kim is worth the travel,” says Lindsay, Seth’s mother. “At Scottish Rite, I know my child has the medical team who roots for him, fights for him, encourages him, champions him and loves him.”

SARAH, OF DALLAS, TX

While playing basketball, Sarah tore her meniscus in both knees. Sports medicine orthopedic surgeon John E. Arvesen, M.D., designed a treatment plan to get her back on the court. Sarah underwent reconstructive surgery on both knees and continued her road to recovery with physical therapy at Scottish Rite for Children at The Star in Frisco. During her sessions, Sarah worked closely with physical therapist Samantha Plaster, P.T., to heal her knees through exercises designed to help her regain range of motion and strength. After six months of physical therapy, Sarah was cleared to play basketball again.

“As soon as Sarah walked into The Star, she noticed many athletic kids like herself, which eased her mind,” says Grace, Sarah’s mother. “It is important to trust the doctors and team at Scottish Rite because they are there to help you.”

He was born with fibular hemimelia in his right leg — a condition in which his fibula, or the small bone in his shin, was shorter than his left. Before Athins could walk, pediatric orthopedic surgeon Corey S. Gill, M.D., M.A., performed a Syme’s amputation to remove Athins’ foot and prepare him for a prosthesis. Athins learned to walk and play with a prosthesis while forming a special bond with his prosthetist Eddie Krusche, M.S., C.P.O., L.P.O. Now, Athins is donning his new Avengers-themed prosthesis, turning everyday moments into superhero adventures as he runs and plays with unstoppable energy.

“Athins would not be where he is today without Scottish Rite,” says Devyn, Athins’ mother. “Since his amputation, his care team has helped him thrive. We are so thankful.”

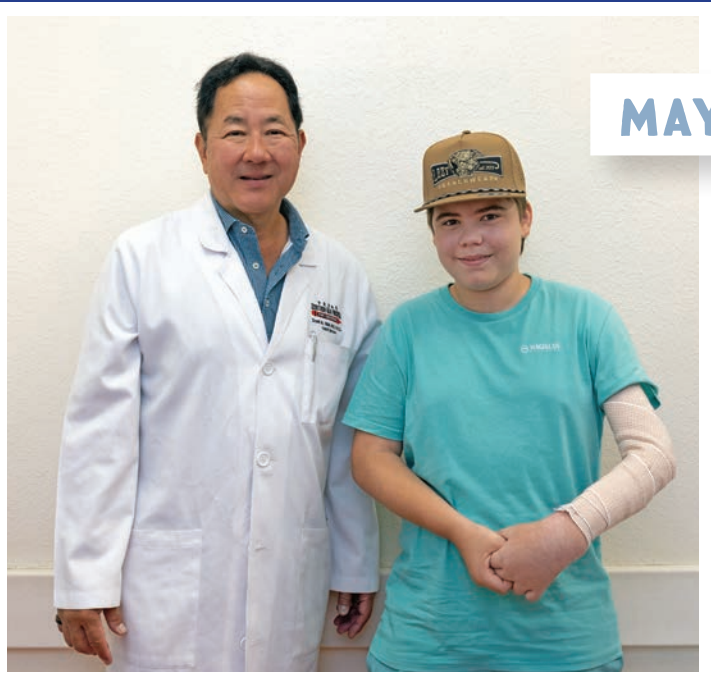

Jett experienced an ATV accident, resulting in a traumatic degloving injury of his left arm. After an initial surgery at a facility in West Texas, Jett and his family were referred to Scottish Rite for Children to receive specialized care from pediatric orthopedic hand surgeon and Director of the Center for Excellence in Hand Scott Oishi, M.D., FACS. Dr. Oishi performed several surgeries and skin grafts on Jett’s arm to heal his skin and wounds. Jett worked with a team of occupational therapists to improve the mobility in his arm, and he continues to make great progress.

“During the hardest year of our lives, Scottish Rite has been heaven-sent,” says Hollie, his mother. “It is easy to feel defeated when there are so many obstacles to overcome. When you are at Scottish Rite, the best of the best will take care of your child.”

Landry was referred to Scottish Rite for Children by her pediatrician, who found a curve in her back. Pediatric orthopedic surgeon Amy L. McIntosh, M.D., confirmed the diagnosis of adolescent idiopathic scoliosis (AIS). “Dr. McIntosh has a gift of easing your mind and reassuring both parents and their child that they are in good hands,” says Leia, Landry’s mother. To prevent her curve from progressing, Landry wears a scoliosis brace. She continues to wear her brace with confidence and takes it off for her favorite activities, like singing in the choir or spiking volleyballs.

“At Scottish Rite, you are part of a family,” Leia says. “From the front desk to the surgeons, every staff member at Scottish Rite is amazing and welcoming.”

At Scottish Rite for Children Orthopedic and Sports Medicine Center in Frisco, certified nurse practitioner Gerad Montgomery, M.S.N., FNP-C, treated Gabby’s arm by administering a short arm cast and then a waterproof cast. Inspired by her care, Gabby looks forward to cartwheeling again and even aspires to work in the Fracture Clinic one day.

“Gerad and his team were so caring and careful with my daughter,” says Letizia, Gabby’s mother. “They are reliable, inviting and understanding of our concerns. Scottish Rite will treat you like family and make sure you are at your best during every visit, which lets us know this is the right place to be.”

When De’Vaun’s parents noticed his left leg had bumps on the skin and was curving inward, the family came to Scottish Rite for Children’s Center for Excellence in Limb Lengthening and Reconstruction (CELLR) for answers. De’Vaun has Ollier disease, which causes masses of benign cartilage to grow in the bones. He also has genu valgum, or knock-knee. CELLR Clinical Director David A. Podeszwa, M.D., applied an external fixator to De’Vaun’s thigh bone that gradually straightened his leg. Thanks to physical therapy and support from his CELLR team, De’Vaun’s fixator has been removed, and he is now walking independently.

“The whole team is literally our family,” says Kristen, De’Vaun’s mother. “They genuinely care for De’Vaun as if he is a child of their own. I couldn’t have asked for a better set of people to be in our lives.”

Rocco is on his way to becoming a soccer legend. During his senior year, Rocco was the captain of his high school soccer team and led them through an undefeated season. When he was 15, Rocco tore his anterior cruciate ligament (ACL) and lateral meniscus in his right knee during a game. Sports medicine orthopedic surgeon John E. Arvesen, M.D., performed ACL reconstruction surgery and a lateral meniscus root repair. With help from Rocco’s care team, including physical therapists and a psychologist, he is back on the field and preparing to continue soccer at the collegiate or international level.

“The fact that Rocco could receive all the help he needed at one place was amazing,” says Jose, Rocco’s father. “Dr. Arvesen and his team understood Rocco’s goals and showed us that his care and recovery were their top priority. Rocco wouldn’t be where he is right now without them.”

Riccio, M.D. To treat his clubfoot, Bobby wears foot abduction orthoses to correct his foot’s alignment and keep it in the proper position. According to his mother, Jewelesha, Bobby is all smiles because of the tailor-made care from Dr. Riccio and his team.

“All parents want is a place that has people they can trust,” says Bobby III, Bobby’s father. “Once you meet anyone at Scottish Rite, all your fears go away. Now, we look forward to seeing how far our son is going to progress.”

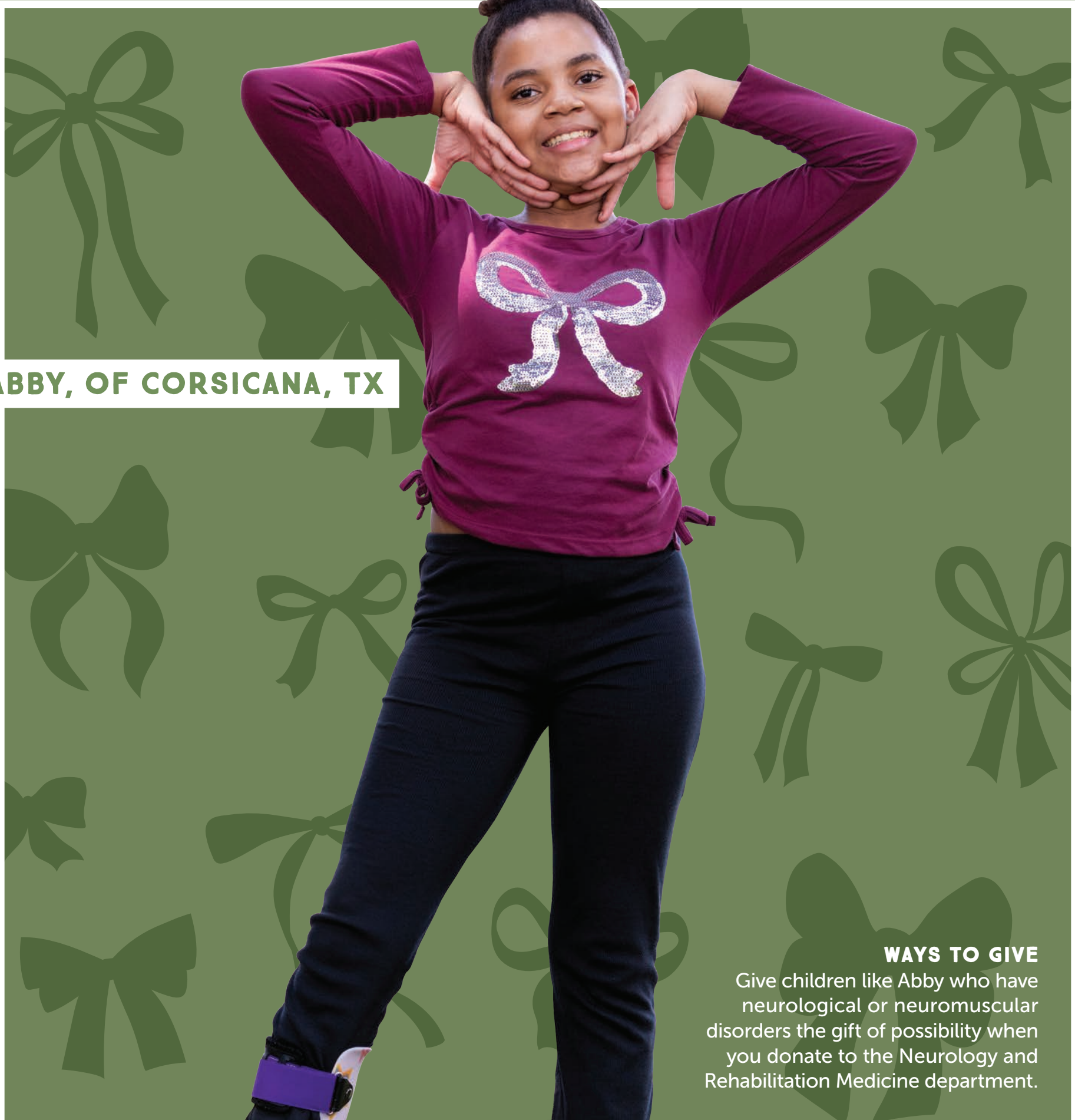

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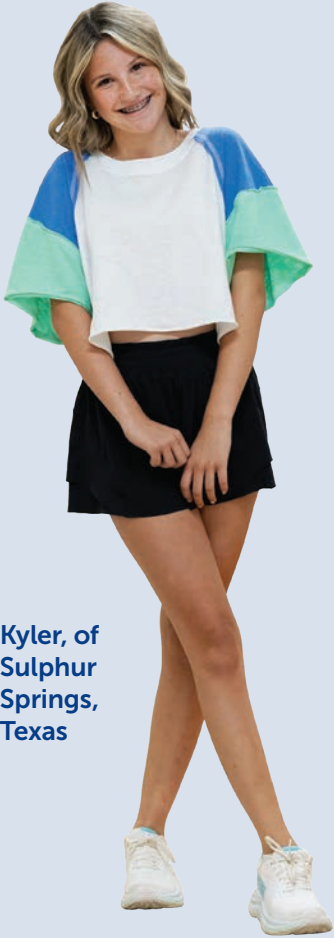
